Carla Pascoe Leahy is an Australian Research Council DECRA Fellow at the University of Melbourne, Joint Editor of *Studies in Oral History* journal, an Associate of the Contemporary Histories Research Group and an Honorary Associate at Museums Victoria. She is a contemporary historian whose research focuses on motherhood and family; children and youth; place, environment and sustainability; and oral history and qualitative research.

Carla is the author of *Spaces Imagined, Places Remembered: Childhood in 1950s Australia* (2011) and co-editor of *Children, Childhood and Cultural Heritage* (2013), *Children's Voices from the Past: New Historical and Interdisciplinary Perspectives* (2019) and *Australian Mothering: Historical and Sociological Perspectives* (2019). Carla is wrapping up an ARC-funded project on the history of Australian motherhood and in 2022 will publish *Becoming a Mother: An Australian History 1945-2020* (Manchester University Press). Next year she begins a new position as Lecturer in Family History at the University of Tasmania.
